Leconfield Coonawarra was established in 1974 by noted oenologist, Sydney Hamilton. He named his estate Leconfield, after his English ancestor, Lord Leconfield, who resided in Petworth Manor House in the south of England. McLaren Vale vineyards take full advantage of the region's proximity to the coast and temperate climate, with Leconfield Manor House Shiraz exhibiting red berries, fresh dark cherries and a hint of white pepper spice, met with exceptional structure and length.

95 Points – Sam Kim, Wine Orbit

Gorgeously rich and enticing, the bouquet shows black/blueberry, violet, cumin and roasted hazelnut aromas, leading to a concentrated palate delivering terrific weight and plump mouthfeel. Splendidly framed by fleshy texture and layers of polished tannins, making it flavoursome and robust with a persistent, structured finish.

At its best: now to 2037.



94 Points - Ken Gargett, Wine Pilot

Leconfield Manor House McLaren Vale Shiraz 2022 (\$40) – An early look at Leconfield's latest foray in McLaren Vale, this time with Shiraz, was exciting. An inky black/purple hue here, the nose offers notes of spices and well-handled oak, with cassis, plums, mocha, dark chocolate, vanilla and nutmeg. There is also the remnants of a richly flavoured fruit cake. The wine is dense but balanced, well focused and with a seductive texture and silky tannins. This is really good and will drink beautifully for at least a decade.

93 Points - Ray Jordan, Wine Pilot

Such an elegantly presented McLaren Vale shiraz pumping out plenty of power and intensity as it drives through a deeply connected palate. Aromas of dark plum and blackberry with a lift of spices, dried herbs and a sprinkle of black pepper. It's juicy and succulent with nice fruit cake and subtle roasted coffee grind characters. Vibrant and lively with an appealing mouth feel. Cellar: 10 years
